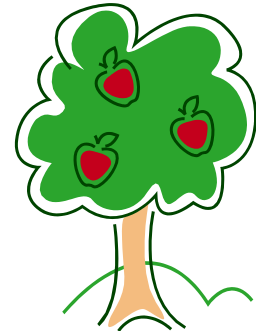


Kindergarten News from
